5 Responsibilities

- Coordinate with SWC and relevant government stakeholders (MoHP, FWD, NHEICC etc.) for project related endeavours and CPAC meetings including project monitoring and evaluation
- Coordinate with SWC and line ministries and departments to facilitate the importation tasks related to project
