Using Data to Identify Priorities and Opportunities





DEVELOPING THE CIP

- Nepal used a data intensive process to identify priority interventions
- Process was led by a Technical Working Group and involved various meetings and discussions
- Key component was the application of the FP Goals Model- a strategic planning tool that helps to identify opportunities and prioritize interventions
 - FP Goals is aligned with the HIPs: it integrates HIPs with the country context and quantifies their impact.



FP Goals Model

- Strategic planning tool that estimates the impact of family planning interventions on mCPR
 - Impacts estimated from all available research linking family planning interventions to increases in mCPR
 - Model 'calibrated' to country context using a range of data on demographics, health system infrastructure, current FP provision, and more.
- Developed for use during the strategic planning process to facilitate evidence-based decision-making.



What types of interventions have demonstrated impact?

Service Delivery Interventions

- Increase Method Availability
- Community Health Workers
- Mobile Clinical Outreach
- Integration: post-abortion/PAC
- Integration: increase use of MCH services
- Integration: Post Partum Family Planning
- Social Franchising
- Pharmacies and Drug Shops
- Vouchers

Youth-focused Interventions

- Multi-component youth programming (with or without YFS)
- Curriculum-based SHR education (peer education or in-school)
- Youth Centers/Youth Corners

Social & Behavior Change

- Mass Media
- Comprehensive Community Engagement (CCE)
- Interpersonal Communication (IPC)

Structural / System Change

- Reduce stock-outs
- Improve the policy environment



FP Goals Model: Which HIPs to Choose?

- Although they are all "high impact" the actual impact for each intervention is different (PPFP is highest)
- Not all may be feasible in your context, or it may take time to get started (most strategic plans are for 5 years)
- What have you already implemented?
- Which HIPs would be easier to introduce or scale up?
- What collection of HIPs will help you reach your goal?

What interventions can help achieve a goal?

Which interventions will lead to the most growth?

- Estimated impact on mCPR






Postpartum Family Planning (PPFP)

PPFP Uptake (at 6 months) by Province




PPFP Uptake by Delivery Place


Availability of PPFP in the Public Sector

Final Decisions

- Initially developed 3 different scenarios:
- Maximizing current infrastructure and contacts
- Leaving no one behind
- Increasing choices

Then combined the positives from these into a final scenario (plus doing some scale up adjustments to reach goal)




Scenario 5: National Impacts

Scenario 5 Total Change in mCPR


% mCPR growth by province




Baseline mCPR

Putting the CIP into Practice

- To get these estimated impacts we actually have to implement the defined scenario
 - This will require everyone (government and partners) to align on priorities and division of responsibility to reach specified scale-up of each intervention

- The model assumes that the interventions are implemented in alignment with High Impact Practices
 - This means the services are high quality
 - Importance for protocols and expectations so everyone is doing the same thing



Benefits

- In addition to achieving our goal for mCPR, implementing the CIP will:
- Provide additional choices to women and couples
- Ensure available resources are maximized and focused
- Reduce inequities within the country by scaling up services in provinces with lower availability
