Background and Purpose:	ADRA, in collaboration with local implementing partners and provincial/municipal governments, is implementing a comprehensive community-based surveillance project focusing on polio, AFP surveillance, zoonotic diseases, VPDs, cross-border health screening, and One Health integration. Community Counsellors serve as a vital extension of the CGPP's community-based platform, helping link underserved populations with essential immunization, maternal–newborn health, and surveillance services. They support routine and supplementary vaccination by mobilizing households, tracking zero-dose and missed children, and coordinating with FCHVs and health facilities to strengthen Polio, VPD, and routine immunization uptake in high-risk and hard-to-reach areas. Counselors provide tailored ANC/PNC counseling to pregnant and postpartum women, promoting 8+ ANC visits, nutrition, danger-sign recognition, and timely facility referrals—aligned with national RMNCAH priorities.	
Scope of work: (Description of services, activities, or outputs)	 Key Roles and Responsibilities Identify and track zero-dose, partially immunized, and missed children through household visits. Mobilize caregivers for routine immunization (RI), outreach clinics, booth sessions, and supplementary immunization activities (SIAs). Coordinate with FCHVs, ANMs, and health facilities to ensure defaulter tracking, follow-up, and improved vaccination coverage. Assist in microplanning, session preparation, community mobilization, and post-campaign monitoring. Conduct active case search during home visits and community gatherings. Report alerts within 24 hours using digital reporting tools linked to DHIS2. Support specimen transport and documentation in coordination with human and animal health offices. Provide tailored counseling for pregnant and postpartum women on ANC/PNC and Immunization of newborns and early initiation of breastfeeding. Facilitate the FCHV for referrals for high-risk pregnancies, danger signs, and emergency care. Conduct small-group sessions with women's groups, fathers' groups, schools, and marginalized populations. 	

	 Promote hygiene behaviors to support infection prevention, immunization success, and maternal—child health. Work with FCHVs and community leaders to overcome myths, rumors, and vaccine hesitancy. Support cross-border awareness and screening in high-risk border pockets. Participate in municipal coordination meetings and CBS review sessions. Maintain updated household tracking registers for immunization and pregnancies. Submit weekly and monthly reports to the field coordinator. Support the quality of surveillance data for municipal and district-level review.
Expected outcome:	 Increased immunization coverage and reduction of zero-dose/under-immunized children. Timely detection and reporting of AFP, VPD, and zoonotic alerts. Improved ANC-PNC attendance and maternal-newborn health outcomes. Strengthened linkages between households, FCHVs, health facilities, and surveillance systems. Enhanced CGPP contribution to sustaining Nepal's polio-free status and strengthening global health security. Ensure respectful, equitable, and culturally sensitive engagement with all communities.
